2) Texas membership	The first business was an open discussion and question answer session with a vote on bringing Texas into the WAQTC membership. Texas informed the group that they do not use AASHTO Test methods. Garth stated this would preclude them from belonging to the TTQP portion of WAQTC. Tim Biel pointed out that they could however belong to the WAQTC according to the bylaws.	Vote was taken 7 yes 1 no Texas voted in as member.	
3)TCCC up-date	As part of the TCCC up-date it was recommended by Garth that another person be added to represent the WAQTC at the TCCC. The recommendation was Linda Hughes from WsDOT. The group was in favor. TCCC and NHI have sent out the RFP for the Structures Inspection course that WAQTC started. Tim Aschenbrener asked if each of the agencies had an Inspector qualification program. Per agency: Texas, Oklahoma, & Colorado just OJT no qualification process Nevada some in service training no qualification process New Mexico Has a RFP out for a consultant to develop inspector modules uses mentoring on the job no qualification process Oregon, Utah building new inspector courses no qualification process Montana basic course work in inspection no qualification process Washington extensive training program no qualification process Idaho coursework and basic qualification process	After the review Tim suggested that a subgroup be put together to look at inspector coursework. No one individual can certify that all the funds exist so we are unable to use them.</p> <p>Mike San Angelo stated that if it was just an issue of FHWA being the lead agency that Alaska would take over as lead agency. However, if that won't help in getting the fund captured then the WAQTC organization would like to know who to contact about this issue.</p> <p>Bernie was asked where we are at with the RFP. He stated he had revised it with the intention of sending out but the funding was a problem No one has seen the revisions.</p>	<p>A letter will be generated by Mike San Angelo explaining that FHWA's accounting practices are creating a real organizational problems for the WAQTC. We are unable to send out our RFP to get a day-to-day program manager on board. Also we are unable to use these funds to travel to our meetings creating an inability to work on materials up-dates. This letter will be sent by both the organization and by the individual agencies.
